
Rehabilitation of York Street On-Ramp to Westbound F.G. Gardiner Expressway

Contract: 24ECS-BE-20SB Start Date: Early August 2024 End Date: Early 2025 *Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto will be rehabilitating the York Street On-Ramp to westbound F.G. Gardiner Expressway. The majority of construction activities will be completed **without any lane closures**, using narrowed lanes to allow for the construction.

This work will ensure that the bridge meets today's standards and remains safe into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2024 Capital Works Program.

WORK DETAILS

The project includes:

- Repair and refurbish the existing York Street On Ramp to Westbound F.G. Gardiner Expressway.
- Repair the concrete parapet wall and railings.
- Patch repair the concrete deck and curbs, and adjacent retaining walls.
- Reface the substructure's piers and abutment.
- Replace the asphalt surface.
- Replace the deck drainage system.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

 You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.



Work Hours: Work is permitted between the hours of 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday to Friday, and 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Saturday, excluding holidays. However, scheduling may vary based on the nature of the work.

Overnight Work: Overnight closures of the ramp are required to complete some tasks throughout the construction. One full weekend closure and approximately

	five overnight closures are anticipated. The first overnight closure is tentatively scheduled for July 31, 2024.
	Timelines for overnight work will be communicated in advance. During these times, construction impacts and noise levels are expected to be similar to daytime construction activities. You may expect that there will be some noise from reversing trucks, jackhammering, and/or loading of materials into trucks for disposal. The City will make efforts to reduce noise impacts specifically during overnight work.
广	Pedestrian Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be pedestrian detours within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
***	Traffic Management : During the construction, the majority of construction activities will be completed with both lanes on the ramp open , using narrowed lanes to accommodate traffic. While the ramp will stay open for the majority of the construction period, one full weekend and approximately five overnight closures are anticipated throughout construction. Details regarding the dates and durations of ramp closures will be communicated in advance.
	On-Site Communication: On rare occasion, contractors may need to communicate with local properties about what is happening on-site. Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector or contact the Field Ambassador listed below.
Ė	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with concrete and/or asphalt where required. Planting will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).
